GA 4, SPECIAL POLITICAL AND DECOLONISATION COMMITTEE

Reminding that the Charter of the UN affirms equal rights to men from all nations,

Stressing that the Charter gives every nation the right to complete freedom and self-determination,

- 1.) Calls upon the UN to accelerate negotiations for a peaceful solution in order to support the further decolonization process of Trust and Non-Self Governing Territories by:
 - a) Instigating a peaceful solution, based upon dialogues between powerful nations and their Trust and Non-Self Governing Territories;
 - b) Giving special attention to the solution which should be freely determined by the people involved; to realise the independence granted by the UN Charter to gain world peace;
- 2.) Calls for positive considerations developed by the Special Political and Decolonisation Committee to equip with a plan of action in full accordance with the guiding documents of the United nations decolonisation process;
- 3) Emphasizes that if the colonies agree they stay dependent in financially and politically aspects until they are ready to build up an sustainable basis themselves, and have a democratic government;
- 4.) Reaffirms that the colonized countries should meet certain requirements:
 - a) a stable economy;
 - b) a legislation based upon human rights;
 - c) cooperation with the UN;

- 5.) Stresses the need to execute the Charter of the UN in order to reach a permanent political solution and prevent conflicts resulting of claims for territories by carrying out measures such as, but not limited to:
- a) negotiations between the concerned states,
 - b) with special attention to the interests of the people living in affected Trust and Non-Self Governing Territories;
- 6.) Expresses its hope to further stimulate the ex-colonies politically, economically and socially to develop a stable political basis.
